Addiscombe District Strategy great opportunity to have your say on the future of Addiscombe

The Addiscombe District Plan could eventually have a large impact on Council priorities and services for all people in Addiscombe. Addiscombe Ward is taking part in a pilot to consult with residents on their priorities.

If you are free, do come along on Monday, 3 March between 5.00 -9.00pm at the Addiscombe Baptist Church (201a Morland Road, the one with the illuminated sign).

This is an informal, drop-in event and vou are invited to come at any time between 5.00 and 9.00pm that is convenient to you; however, the organisers would like to encourage people to come at 7.00pm if they can, when residents can discuss any outstanding issues as a group.

In the autumn a number of us attended one or more of five workshops to help

form the strategy:

Children and Young People - There is a need to engage the interest of young people and give them opportunities to take on responsibility. A range of activities were suggested.

Economy and District Centres - Focussed on the Cherry Orchard Road end of Addiscombe and how to make it more attractive to shoppers and businesses.

Health and Social Care - We looked at isolation among some older people and young mothers.

Environment and Housing - A range of issues were raised including change of our built environment from houses to flats with loss of gardens. Problems of absentee landlords.

Proposed huge development in Cherry Orchard Road

Property developer, Menta, have engaged Ken Shuttleworth, architect of the Gherkin, to draw up plans for an eye catching, massive development in Cherry Orchard Road. This includes knocking down the meat processing plant and replacing it with a new Royal Mail sorting office. The site at the top of Cherry Orchard Road would then be a very large mixed use development of office, retail and homes. There would be four striking tall towers, the highest being 46 storeys. There would be a public piazza running between the towers linking Cherry Orchard Road to a new East Croydon concourse. The current Porter and Sorter would be knocked down but a new site would be provided for it within the development.
