## A Sunday in August South Norwood Country Park

This is close to the Country Park and you could just do the walk round the park ending back at the tram stop about an hour later.

# **Proposed Cherry Orchard Road development**

Following the articles in our previous two newsletters and the very interesting information given at our Annual Residents Meeting by our Councillors and MP, it is apparent the majority of residents (but not all) are against the proposed building of a 53 storey tower by developer Menta.

For those who wish to express their views – there is an Open Meeting on **Wednesday 15 June, 7.00 pm at Oval School,** entrance in Cherry Orchard Road. The aim of this meeting is primarily to register strength of opposition to the tower.

For those who are in favour of the Menta development in its entirety, there is a local group of residents, **Residents for Regeneration**, who are campaigning for Croydon Council to grant planning permission. It is a web based campaign at residentsforregen.wordpress.com.

At the moment Croydon Council's decision could go either way. Although the stated deadline for comments has passed, you can still contact the Council with them - planning application number 11/00981/P. If you have strong views – now is your opportunity to make them heard and show your support for one of the campaigns. Whichever decision the Council makes, it will have a huge impact on our area.

The Fox Project is a charity dedicated to the red fox and operates in the South East including South East London. They deal with sick and injured foxes. They also operate a specialist fox deterrence and advice service which, they say, is more effective and more humane than 'outmoded pest control'.
