The Have Your Say event is organised by a group of local East Croydon people whose aim is to give everyone in the area an opportunity to express their views on what they would like to see happen for our area. This can include absolutely anything. The ultimate aim is to inform Croydon Council of what residents *really* think and want.

It will be a resident-led, informal event with people sitting round tables of six to eight. Everyone is very welcome. There will be a children's play area (unsupervised) and, if the weather is fine, the children can play safely on fenced grass directly outside the hall. Refreshments will be available but feel free to bring something along to share, if you would like.

It will be a time when ideas can be freely exchanged in a way that respects everyone's views. There'll even be an artist/cartoonist present to capture the issues being raised so they can also be viewed in a visual way. Our elected representatives will be there to hear what locals have to say and give information where that helps the discussion. Also to inform discussion, should people so wish, we have invited representatives from the company who collect our rubbish and recycling and from one of the companies currently digging up our roads.

If the event is successful, it will become regular. It will give local people a good chance for our voices to be heard. Come along and see what happens!

#### Spring is in the air!

As Spring is in the air, we'll turn our minds to greenery. Please note – you do not need to have access to the space at the back of your house or block to have a garden. You can create one in just a single pot on your own window ledge or steps.

As we need to watch how much water we use, here are just a few easy to grow plants that do not need too much. They can be grown in the ground or in pots. Mediterranean herbs (thyme, rosemary, lavender); succulents (but many don't like getting wet in winter); plants with silver foliage; certain flowering plants (pinks (dianthus) of all colours, red pelargoniums/ geraniums, alyssum, lavatera, morning glory, nasturtiums, potentilla, oleander).

Here's information on two local places where you can find plants.

#### **Cherry Orchard Garden Centre**

This is brilliant! The Cherry Orchard Garden Centre on Sydenham Road (by junction with St James Road) is a community project. Many of the plants are raised from seed or cutting on the premises. It's amazingly cheap and you can often find unusual things not available in shops or chain garden centres.

Opening hours are Monday–Friday 9.30am–4pm (all year), Saturday 10am–2pm (Easter till early July).

#### **Earthly Treasures in Addiscombe**

Clyde Road resident, Anne Barcellos, tells us about her favourite garden shop.

Have you discovered Ground Jewels, a locally run family business offering a one stop garden shop at 321 Lower Addiscombe Road( near the big Co-op) yet? Tom and Joe Benedict with help from Joe's long term partner, Louisa, offer a variety of products for general garden use, such as plants, flowers, seeds, soils and tools for a range of gardeners, from the more experienced horticulturists to the everyday gardener and are happy to give free and friendly advice. In addition to the wide array of merchandise offered, they also provide professional, experienced and personal garden services from general garden maintenance to more significant landscaping and re-designing projects at highly competitive prices.

They hold seasonal events such as wreath making classes at Christmas and hanging basket classes held on summer evenings to which everyone is welcome.

They are keen to contribute to the local community and Joe has done talks to local nurseries and schools and has donated plants and other garden supplies to summer fetes and various charitable fundraisers. He is always willing to promote other local businesses, schemes and events within the community through the shop so don't hesitate to approach him if you want something publicised in the window. The bulbs which we are now beginning to brighten up Addiscombe Railway Park were sourced through the shop.

I have used them lots of times from purchasing plants for my own use and to give as gifts to taking my first tentative steps into patio grown potatoes with their advice and would recommend them highly.

#### Garden waste recycling

Each household should receive two clear sacks to collect green garden waste. You can buy additional sacks from the library for £1. Up to six clear sacks will be collected at a time; they must be the ones that the council has provided as they can'see what is inside.

Garden waste recycling will be collected fortnightly on the same day as we put out our green recycling boxes. Our first garden waste collection will be on Wednesday 2 May. It will continue till the end of November.
