Addiscombe Carnival 2011

Residents working together in East Croydon / Addiscombe

A number of local residents feel we need to encourage a sense of community and to speak and act collectively on certain issues where possible.

The *Have your Say* event in April was open to everyone. Over 50 residents spanning from the Cherry Orchard Road end of Addiscombe to the Ashburton end gathered. We came together and looked at what people like about our area and would like to keep; we also looked at what people would like to change. There were a lot of different ideas but we could detect certain trends.

We also identified four activities that are achievable in the short term. These are constructive, positive ways of making our place an even better place in which to live. Four different people are organising these.

1. Addiscombe in Action

This will involve practical activities with a sociable side! Litter picking and graffiti removal are just two ideas. Our first Walkabout will take place probably end June / July and anyone is welcome to join us. Exact details are yet to be confirmed but it will probably involve starting with coffee / late breakfast at a café in Cherry Orchard Road followed by litter picking in the area and ending up at the Sir Philip Game Centre.

2. Communications between residents in the East Croydon / Addiscombe area

A second group is looking at various different ways in which residents can communicate with each other. These will provide a means of informing each other of local events. Possible methods include paper, email, Twitter and a website.

3. Promoting Addiscombe businesses

A third group is looking at ways of promoting the various small businesses in our area. When people arrive at East Croydon Station, all the signposts point towards the centre of town. We want to examine ways of promoting for example the very good restaurants we have in our area.

4. Addiscombe Arts Festival

A fourth group is looking at the possibility of organising an Addiscombe Arts Festival!

Our Bobbies on the Beat (Safer Neighbourhood Team)

Our Safer Neighbourhood Team have been here for us when we have most needed it and we are very grateful to them for that.

If you haven't seen so much of them recently, it is because they have had to concentrate a lot of their efforts elsewhere in Addiscombe. In a way this is a good thing!

Despite some of our team having to cover the Diamond Jubilee events in London, the Olympics and Paralympics, our local team will be keeping an eye on our area.

Their current priorities, set every three months by a panel of residents (Ward Panel) in discussion with the Police are:

- * Road Safety (speeding)
- * Antisocial behaviour in Academy Gardens

The Ward Panel will shortly have its own website so residents can contact them directly about any issues they may have.

In the meantime if there is something you think should be a priority, please let Anne know.

Your views important! Possible Neighbourhood Plan?

It is *really important that we know your views* as to whether or not you think our two roads should form part of a possible Neighbourhood Plan.

The Neighbourhood Plan is something on which we are consulting with our residents. The possibility of forming this came into effect on 1 April this year with the *Localism Act*. The Government describes it as 'a new way for communities to decide the future of the places where they live and work'.

They also state 'Neighbourhood planning empowers communities to shape the development and growth of a local area through the production of a neighbourhood development plan, a neighbourhood development order or a Community Right to Build Order.'

Basically, if enough residents in the East Croydon / Addiscombe area would like their own Neighbourhood Plan, it means *in theory* that we could have more say on what is built where and what it looks like. Providing what residents want in their Plan does not contradict existing Croydon Council planning rules, then what goes in the Plan can affect which planning applications are agreed.

Needless to say that is a simplistic summary and there is a lot more to it! Before opting for this, we need to have a clear idea of people's views.
