Growing your own food in pots!

Clyde Road residents, Liz and Ariel, tell us about their success in growing food in pots. You don't need a garden! Why not have a go?

During the rationing of the Second World War, people started growing vegetables in whatever open space they could find. Similarly, in the current economic climate, there's concern about the price of fresh fruit and veggies. So if you share this concern, here's a way you can grow indoor veggies - and enjoy yourself - for a song.

It may seem like a tricky time of year to grow anything, with occasional snow showers still forecast. But you don't need expensive equipment, a greenhouse or an allotment. Chances are you'll have a sunny windowsill or ledge that's perfect for a few potted plants. Seed packets cost about a pound at your local supermarket or nursery.

We started our garden with a small, sunny patch near our back door, a wire trolley, a bag of compost (available for free from the local waste depot, as a reward for recycling)



and a packet of Mediterranean seeds - tomatoes, aubergines, rocket, basil, oregano and a traffic light mix of peppers. We also found a garlic clove left over from our weekly market shop, which had just developed a small green shoot. We upcycled some yogurt pots and strawberry punnets into seed trays, labelled these trays, planted the seeds and the clove, watered them and waited.

Within three days the rocket seedlings had begun to sprout, and within a week, they resembled a small forest. The garlic's single shoot had split into two, then, before we knew it, three and four. The peppers took the longest to germinate - over a month - but just when we were about to give them up for dead, the first translucent, green-purple shoots emerged from the earth a few days ago.

It's still early days to harvest, but with just the price of seeds and recycled containers, what better way to appreciate the relaxing beauty of plants, keep yourself healthy, and save money at the same time, than by starting a mini kitchen garden?
